

# **Seaford College EAL Provision**

### **Definition of EAL**

The term English as an Additional Language (EAL) is used when referring to pupils whose main language at home is a language other than English.

In England, such learners are defined as those who have been 'exposed to a language at home that is known or believed to be other than English' (Department for Education, 2019).

A child must not be regarded as having a learning difficulty solely because the language (or form of language) in which he or she is or will be taught is different from a language (or form of language) which is or has been spoken at home (section 20 (4) Children and Families Act 2014). However, pupils whom English is an additional language will be provided with appropriate support provided they meet the school's academic criteria.

Regular and effective liaison between everyone involved in the teaching and care of EAL students is provided. This may include attending departmental meetings, observing EAL students in mainstream classes, designing and delivering teacher development sessions, informal advice to colleagues, preparing Individual Reports, liaison with pastoral staff, etc

Liaison with school leadership, boarding staff, teachers, and support staff to ensure a cohesive approach to EAL provision

## Monitoring

Alongside EAL co-ordinator, students are monitored by SENCo, Head of Academic Access and Achievement and Head of Learning Support Prep and for transition periods holistic support is co-ordinated.

Assessment progress data for EAL students is maintained and shared using the Bell Foundation progress tracker and programme reporting mechanism. Contributing to wider data bases, student's academic progress is monitored and fed into the school's academic reporting system.

Constant monitoring is achieved through the graduated approach using assess, plan, do, review
